#### **Mission Statement**

## **High School Facts**

Founded in 1961, Padua Franciscan High School is a coed college preparatory high school with approximately 800 students. The school year consists of two 90-day semesters with four 9-week grading periods. The school day consists of eight 41-minute periods. The school is not on a block schedule.

60% of Padua's faculty, including administration and counseling staff, have earned their Master's degree or higher.

Educational Resources: We serve students under IDEA. Padua also has the services of Intervention Specialists, an Intervention Specialist/English Teacher, and Intervention Specialist/Math Teacher, School Psychologist, and a Speech-Language Pathologist..

The school is chartered as a College Preparatory High School by the State of Ohio and accredited by the Ohio Catholic Accrediting Association and AdvancEd Accreditation Commission.

Padua Franciscan High School is both an SAT and an ACT test administration center.


