Uniform Requirements

ALL band members are required to have the Marching Bruins t-shirt, marching shoes/boots, and the drawstring bag. All brass and woodwind players are required to have gloves. Drumline and electric bass do not need to purchase gloves. All auxiliary members are required to purchase their show-specific hair pieces and a warm-up jacket. A PFHS drawstring bag is required for ALL members; the PFHS duffel bag is not required.

Woodwind/Brass

Flip Folders (near \$10 each)


Flip folders are available at most music retail stores.

Please consider replacing the plastic rings with loose leaf metal rings for stability. These are available at office supply aisles and stores. It is also recommended you order extra window sleeves to contain all your music (sold at music stores.)










Flute/Piccolo flip folders attach on the wrist (sometimes sousaphone players prefer this style)

All other instruments usually attach to a lyre; this is preferable for removing or flipping the flip folders at a fast rate (rather than unscrewing them from the bell of a horn.)

Lyres (near \$10 each)

Each-instrument should have a place for a lyre; talk to the retail store about options. Here are some examples of what lyres look like for each instrument. It is recommended that you take your instrument with you to the retail store so they can fit it with the correct lyre type.



Drumline

Members of the drumline will use the following items during the season:

Drumsticks (\$9-12 per pair) - Snare: Vic Firth Corpsmaster Signature, Ralph Hardimon, Wood Tip

Flip Folio - Same folio as woodwinds & brass (see above)

- You do NOT need to purchase a "drum lyre/mount" because this doesn't attach easily to the drums

BENEFITS OF ELEMENTARY STUDENT PARTICIPATION

The primary benefit of an elementary student participating in the Marching Bruins is the experience of performing in an advanced performance ensemble. Students who are ready to perform at a high school level have an exciting opportunity that allows for performance opportunities on a weekly basis, as well as experiencing a different type of ensemble experience. Students who join the marching band typically improve in musical and movement ability and enjoy being part of the group.

ELEMENTARY STUDENT REQUIREMENTS

To be eligible to participate in the Marching Bruins, students must be:

- 1. Entering 7th or 8th grade in the Fall of the marching band season.
- 2. Be able to participate at a 9th grade or higher level of ability, a minimum of two years playing the instrument and current participation in their school band program.
- 3. Willing to participate as a **full member**.

FULL MEMBER REQUIREMENTS

As a full member of the group each student must be willing to commit to the mandatory events of the group. Due to the nature of a marching band, each member is a vital part of the team. Marching band shows are designed to include each member in a specific place on the field.

With that in mind, participants must commit to attendance and participation in the following:

- 1. ALL Padua Franciscan HS football games for the season (including post-season if necessary).
- 2. ALL Padua Franciscan HS MB performances, summer rehearsals, rehearsals after school (dates included on season schedule).

To be a responsible team member, participants must also be:

- 1. Willing to learn and/or memorize music, drills, and marching techniques.
- 2. Willing to follow the rules of the Marching Bruins Handbook.

ELEMENTARY RULE CLARIFICATIONS

Elementary students are required to follow the rules listed in the Marching Bruins Handbook. A few exceptions may occur:

- a. Late Elem. Dismissals: Students who attend elementary schools that are dismissed near or later than 3:45 pm may make arrangements with the director for a reasonable arrival time of the student.
- b. *Elem. Band Rehearsals*: Students who have band after school should attend their rehearsal before attending the marching band rehearsal. Please make arrangements with the director for arrival time of student.
- c. Elem. School Conflicts with Rehearsals: Marching Bruin rehearsals should be a priority, but when conflicts occur, please make arrangements with the director prior to the conflict according to Marching Band Policy.
- d. *Elem. School Conflicts with Performances*: Marching band performances should be a priority. Unavoidable conflicts MUST be communicated with the director.
- 2. *Rallies*: Elementary students are NOT required to perform on rally days at the high school. However, if a student is shadowing on a day of a rally, he or she is welcome to play with the high school students from 7:45-7:55 am in the lobby and during the rally in the afternoon. Please make arrangements with the director prior to the day of the rally.
- 3. Grading: Elementary students are not graded.
- 4. *Uniform*: Elementary students need to follow the uniform guidelines in the handbook.
- 5. Performing Ability: Elementary students are held at the same standard as the high school students in this high school performing group.

Music, choreography, and drill standards are set at a high school level. With that said, the directors are very accommodating and willing to help students achieve that level, but students must be proactive in asking for assistance.

If an elementary student is not meeting the performance expectations of the ensemble, the director(s) will contact the guardians for a discussion of the student's participation in the Marching Bruins. If there are concerns regarding a student's ability level, the guardians are always welcome to initiate a conversation with the director(s).
